The COVID-19 pandemic has changed so many things. At DVRC, we immediately realized the importance of being extremely flexible and thoughtful in our design. We knew that as an agency, we needed to make sure that we were ready to provide what survivors of domestic violence needed. We knew that our culture is one of continuous review and refinement, a willingness to take bold action, an incredibly professional staff, continued support from the community, and above all, an absolute commitment and sense of duty to the survivors we serve. What we all shared during 2020 was the spirit, passion, and determination to answer the call for making sure that survivors received programs and services that would educate, support, and empower them.

Even though 2020 was a year of uncertainty, DVRC still had some incredible achievements!

- Expanded our Housing Program with 10 additional Sojourner's House scattered-site permanent housing residences.
- Implemented a tele-health option for survivors to safely seek services during the pandemic by providing advocacy, individual counseling, and group counseling through Zoom.
- Expanded counseling services for Spanish speakers with new options for groups and individual services.
- Provided financial assistance to survivors struggling during the pandemic.
- Established the Emergency Stay Fund to support emergency shelter needs.
- Continued the remodel of Mary Mac House.
- Continued our partnership with Pacific University's College of Optometry to provide a free eye clinic to low-income, uninsured survivors.

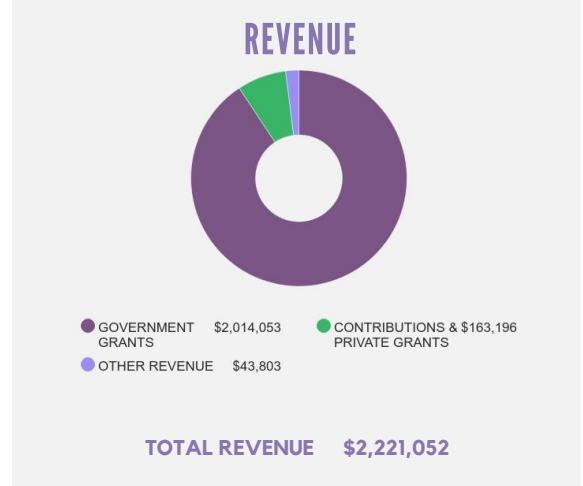
